Local supply contract awarded to Exmouth Freight & Logistics

When Santos' Ningaloo Vision Floating, Production, Storage and Offloading vessel returns to the field next year, the crew will be in for a treat. Food supplies for the vessel will now be sourced from local Exmouth businesses under a new supply contract with Exmouth Freight & Logistics.

Exmouth Freight & Logistics Director Shane Coote says the commitment by Santos to 'support local' is an unprecedented initiative that will substantially benefit local small businesses in Exmouth and create several new jobs.

"As a popular seasonal tourist destination, small businesses in Exmouth face the challenge of maintaining cash flow year-round. Santos' decision to source food stores from the community will help provide a stronger trade consistently throughout the year. The flow on effect for the greater community will be tremendous. These are the same small businesses that help fund our local sports clubs and community events."

Santos news

The third quarter saw two significant milestones for our LNG facilities: during September Santos' GLNG project on Curtis Island in Queensland delivered its 400th LNG cargo and on October 3, Darwin LNG loaded its 750th cargo from the facility since production started in 2006.

While celebrating these export milestones, Santos continues its unwavering support of the Australian domestic market. Santos is Australia's biggest domestic gas supplier, supplying around 20 per cent of Australian domestic demand in 2019. Click [here](#) to learn about Santos' contribution to Australian industry.

Both the New South Wales Independent Planning Commission (IPC) and Federal Environment Minister Sussan Ley announced their decision to green light the Narrabri Gas Project with conditions, on September 30 and November 24 respectively. Santos accepts the conditions proposed by the IPC and the Federal Department of Agriculture, Water and Environment and will now embark on a 12-18-month appraisal program ahead of a Final Investment Decision (FID) for the next phase of project development.

Santos also successfully injected approximately 100 tonnes of carbon dioxide deep underground into depleted gas reservoirs as part of the final field trial for the Moomba Carbon Capture and Storage (CCS) Project. Ultimately, the Moomba CCS Project has the potential to store up to 20 million tonnes of carbon dioxide per annum, with the goal of driving down Australia's carbon emissions and contributing to the world's climate goals.

Quarterly activity report

Third quarter production of 25.1 mmbœ* was a record for Santos and 22% higher than the prior quarter. Production was higher in all five core assets, primarily driven by higher domestic gas and LNG volumes.

Santos' disciplined, low-cost operating model combined with our portfolio of fixed-price domestic gas contracts, enabled us to deliver higher quarterly revenues and consistent free cash flow generation despite the impact of significantly lower oil price-linked and contracted LNG prices. Q & A with Exmouth Freight & Logistics

Exmouth Freight & Logistics has been operating from the North West Cape for over 30 years. Over time, we have grown from what was a small freight agency making local deliveries, into an integrated provider of transport and logistics solutions to and from the region. Our services have evolved in response to client needs and we've done this by constantly challenging ourselves to come up with solutions that make life easier for our clients. Our mission is to be the most comprehensive provider of logistics solutions to and from the North West Cape.

Santos is committed to creating a positive legacy in WA, specifically the Perth, Exmouth and Karratha communities through targeted community and social initiatives. Here we highlight some recent activities.

Good Sammy - Containers for Change

Santos is supporting long term community partner Good Sammy Enterprises under the new Containers for Change program. Good Sammy is one of about 200 refund point locations approved under the program and is currently the largest individual collection contractor with 16 drop off points around the metropolitan area (in addition to its processing centre in Canning Vale).

Santos will deliver all its eligible containers to Good Sammy for recycling and donate the 10-cent refund on eligible containers. Good Sammy has employed more than 40 additional people with a disability at their Canning Vale site to help process these containers.

Santos' participation is being coordinated by our Offshore logistics team who saw this as a great opportunity to support recycling and a local charity at the same time. The team estimate

sustainably growing their businesses, especially in remote, rural areas. Imperative to realising sustainable growth is having the trust and commitment of key clients to invest in your business by way of long-term commercial support. For us, Santos has been that key client. In 2007 Santos took a chance on our business and gave us the opportunity to provide onshore support for the Ningaloo Vision Floating Production Storage and Offloading vessel. Since then, we have progressed from providing fundamental onshore support to delivering full scale project and logistical support for Santos.

What are some of the flow on effects for the community?

We have been able to grow our business to provide a broader range of services to benefit the region. We now have two depots, one in Exmouth and one in Onslow and employ 11 people who all live locally, spend locally, and support local schools and clubs. Our own business mantra is to support local and a great example of this is our new contract to supply Santos' Floating, Production, Storage and Offloading vessel with food supplies sourced from local Exmouth businesses.

What is your commitment to local employment?

We are committed to employing 100 per cent local residents and take pride in the fact we offer our community long term employment opportunities. Paramount to the continued growth of our business has been having a team of well trained, skilled, and professional staff.

Exmouth Marine Rescue

Exmouth Marine Rescue is a volunteer organisation providing an essential sea safety service to the Exmouth community. This year, an increase in local tourism has provided a great boost for the region, however it has also placed significant increased demand on the marine rescue service.

The group now has 52 volunteers. Year to date, the volunteers have contributed 481 man-hours to attend 39 incidents. Santos' support for the service has focused on supporting volunteers and helping them feel part of a valued community team. Past support has included communication equipment, a BBQ for the group's volunteer base and club shirts. This year, Santos has again supplied club shirts for the volunteers.

Vice Commander Rusty Ellis says, "These shirts are quite valuable to us as part of our 'social fabric' and they help galvanise our team in a less official capacity whilst making the community aware of our existence.
