Santos Support Worker Traineeship

In August, we launched the 2021 intake of the Santos Support Worker Traineeship through Charles Darwin University. The traineeship enables Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Territorians to gain a Certificate III in Individual Support – a nationally accredited qualification to work in aged care or disability care. The program increases positive social impact for Indigenous people through employment and training opportunities, while addressing the skills shortage of qualified carers in the NT.

The traineeship was developed in consultation with the Wickham Point Deed Reference Group – the representative group of Larrakia families who are the traditional custodians of Wickham Point, where the Santos-operated Darwin LNG plant is located. Aged and disability care was identified as an area of need within the Larrakia community and reflected in national workforce reports identifying the high demand for personal care and community workers across the Territory.

The traineeship runs for nine months comprising two days of study and three days of paid work per week. Mentoring is provided by Saltbush Social Enterprises and the cohort is well supported by CDU and Santos' community team.

The skills and experience achieved through this course are a solid pathway into the health care industry and are transferable to day-to-day family care needs. The trainees are on track to graduate in early 2022, and the Santos team are looking forward to the celebration.

Santos news

In December, Santos and Oil Search completed their proposed merger to create a regional champion of size and scale. The merger will deliver a company with a market cap of more than A\$20 billion and that is in the top-20 ASX-listed companies and the 20 largest global oil and gas companies.

Importantly the merger creates a company that will have the balance sheet to fund major projects across Australia, Timor-Leste, Papua New Guinea and Alaska. This merger comes at a time of consolidation in the oil and gas sector. For the sector, size, scale and strong free cash flow generation will be critical

through the energy transition and the continued development of resources. This merger positions Santos for success in the new era of cleaner energy and clean fuels.

In November, Santos Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer Kevin Gallagher announced a final investment decision to progress with the A\$220 million Moomba carbon capture and storage project.

“This carbon reduction project in the South Australian outback will be one of the biggest and lowest cost in the world and will safely and permanently store 1.7 million tonnes of carbon dioxide per year in the same reservoirs that held oil and gas in place for tens of millions of years,” Mr Gallagher said.

Local operations

Below is a snapshot of some recent activity in the Northern Territory:

- + Santos was the platinum sponsor of the 2021 South East Asia Australia Offshore & Onshore Conference (SEAAOC) in Darwin in October. Santos CEO Kevin Gallagher addressed the main conference, speaking about opportunities in the Territory as well as the global energy transition and importance of making hydrocarbon fuels cleaner. Santos hosted the welcome reception, where all attendees were welcomed to country by Auntie Bilawara Lee, Larrakia Elder, Charles Darwin University academic, and long-time Larrakia Reference Group member for DLNG.
- + In October, Darwin LNG celebrated shipment of its 800th cargo of LNG. Since start-up in 2006, Darwin LNG has safely shipped an average of one LNG cargo per week.

The Santos Science Experience

The popular Santos Science Experience was held at Charles Darwin University Casuarina Campus from 21–23 September. Around 100 Year 9 students from 15 schools across Darwin, Palmerston, Katherine, Alice Springs, the Tiwi Islands and Elcho Island in North-east Arnhem Land travelled to attend the three-day Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) program.

Students from Santos' community partners Clontarf and Stars Foundations also participated in the event, enjoying various STEM related programs and listened to guest speaker presentations. Science Experience activities explored topics such as medical laboratory experiments, exercise and sports science, NT medical program, engineering, aquaculture, health science, trades, oil and gas, and virtual reality technology.

Santos Rotating Equipment Engineer Stu Barz gave an engaging presentation about his career pathway from STEM learning through to his current job at Darwin LNG. He answered many

questions from students interested in the industry at the end of his presentation. The Santos Science Experience is an annual program designed to inspire school students to consider STEM-related study and career pathways. It has been held in Darwin since 2006 and has seen thousands of Territory students take part in engaging, hands-on activities and seminars.
